

Oregon's PDMP Integration Initiative Monthly Report | December 2018

The Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) Integration initiative brings controlled substance prescription data from PDMP registries to authorized Oregon prescribers and pharmacists electronically within their health information technology (HIT). This initiative aligns with broader state and federal efforts to increase use of PDMPs to reduce inappropriate prescriptions, improve patient outcomes, and promote more informed prescribing practices.

HIT Commons Celebrates Successful 2018 PDMP Integrations

HIT Commons met the PDMP Integration Steering Committee's year one goals for integrating PDMP data into prescriber and pharmacist health IT systems. As of December, **3,666 prescribers and 2 pharmacy chains (representing more than 240 pharmacists) have access to PDMP data** within their daily electronic work flows. More than **12,000** prescribers across **74** entities have started the process to connect and will likely be coming on in **2019**.

Additional successes include:

- ✓ **134% increase** in the total number of PDMP queries submitted through integration, EDIE and web browser in 2018 (compared to 2017). This exceeded our year one goal.
- ✓ HIT Commons is supporting widespread interest and adoption of PDMP integration:
 - Electronic health record (EHR) or Health Information Exchange (HIE) integrations:
 13 entities live, 14 in integration phase, and 60 in application phase
 - o EDIE: 27 hospitals live
 - Pharmacies: 2 retail pharmacy chains live
- ✓ HIT Commons and OHA PDMP program staff have presented across Oregon on the PDMP Integration, effectively getting the word out about the statewide subscription and enrollment process.







Overview of the Initiative

The PDMP Integration initiative leverages shared funding to cover a statewide subscription allowing integration of PDMP data into health IT systems, is built upon a public/private governance model, and is focused on transitioning authorized Oregon prescribers and pharmacists from accessing PDMP data through a web portal to through their HIT over the next three years.

PDMP Integration Initiative Goals:

- Increased use of PDMP data at the point of care
- Improved access and prescriber efficiency
- Minimized changes to current workflow
- **Optimized** prescribing practices
