This expands access to statewide data beyond ED physicians to health plans, CCOs and others involved in care coordination for COVID-19 positive individuals as the pandemic enters a new phase.

PDMP Integration

- As part of the Harold Rogers Grant, a PDMP integration evaluation was launched online last month. Primary goals are to capture provider perceptions of PDMP EHR integration including barriers, practice impacts, methods of use. With almost 300 responses, we have started an early report of findings to share with OHA and Comagine for qualitative analysis.
- New features are available through the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program Web Portal (or PDMP AWAReE). We are assisting our partners in Public Health at OHA with promoting awareness and adoption of both of these tools.
 - As of April 27th, **Prescriber Activity Reports** are sent quarterly to prescribers which allow them to compare their prescribing trends to others within their specialty. HIT Commons has been working with OHA to highlight the availability of these reports via stakeholder presentations and email communications. Feedback from prescribers which will be incorporated into future presentations and recommendations for spread.
 - In addition, the **Oregon PDMP Organization Management** module (OPOM) will give medical, dental and pharmacy leadership access to **Prescriber Activity Reports** for providers within their span of accountability. We are currently soliciting feedback from several engaged clinical leaders serving as early adopters. Based on their input and suggested use cases, recommendations for rollout on a broader scale will be delivered to OHA early next month.
- July 8: The PDMP Integration Steering Committee adopted revisions to their charter which can be found [here](#). The new integration report was presented, showing a 3% increase in users of PDMP between Q1-Q2 2021.
- 24 new entities are live with PDMP integration in this quarter including several behavioral health, dental and independent practices. See the full report [on our webpage](#) for more details.

What Are The Results?

ED Utilization Reports from Apprise



QUARTERLY EDIE ANALYTICS DASHBOARDS For the Period: Q1 2020 – Q4 2020

The most recent data reporting through Q4 2020 show a sharp decrease in ED utilization primarily due to the COVID-19 pandemic:

- The total number of ED visits decreased by 18.3%
- The number of High Utilizer visits decreased by 19.8%
- Co-morbid Mental Health related visits decreased by 6%
- Co-morbid Substance Use Disorder related visits decreased by 11.4%
- Potentially Avoidable visits from High Utilizers decreased by 34%
- Visits decreased by 33% in the 90 days following an initial care guideline

Dashboard reports posted [here](#). HIT Commons will be monitoring these data points as COVID-19 recovery continues.

PDMP Quarterly Dashboard (Q3 2020-Q4 2020)

- Integrated queries increased 28%, while web portal queries decreased by 10%
- The number of unique providers submitting queries increased 35%
- 95% of top 2,000 prescribers and 95.5% of top 4,000 prescribers queried PDMP in Q1 2021

- +5.3% MD/PA/DO (12,672 integrated users)
- +6.5% NPs/CNS-PP (2,897 integrated users)
- +2.3% NDs (399 integrated users)
- The number of prescriptions for controlled substances continue to decrease with the exception of amphetamines and oxycodone.

Oxycodone	+2.2%
Tramadol	-4.6%
Amphetamines	+9.9%
Benzodiazepines	% change – 2Q 2019*
Lorazepam	-3.2%

Clonazepam	-6.1%

Other Oregon HIT events and updates

The [Health Information Technology Oversight Council \(HITOC\)](#) which governs Health IT strategy in Oregon is ramping up to update the state's strategic plan for health IT. HITOC will likely conduct several working groups over the next 6-12 months on topics like health information exchange, community information exchange, and other areas to address the state's health care priorities. HIT Commons will be participating in the planning with OHA on the strategic plan update, which is expected to be completed near October 2022.
