Douglas County, through support from the [IMPACTS](#) grant to better serve individuals who are utilizing jails and emergency departments, has partnered with their county jail leadership to add jail booking/release information into the Collective platform. This information is being generated into daily reports that community partners can leverage to better coordinate care for those who have been recently incarcerated, or recently released back to the community. Stronger coordination for incarcerated individuals is called out as an important area for improvement in the recent Oregon [Medicaid waiver renewal](#). Other HIT Happenings across the State of Oregon: Oregon Health Authority (OHA): [OHA's Health Information Technology Oversight Council \(HITOC\)](#) is engaged in updating the Health IT Strategic Plan for Oregon. Currently, work is focused on a [Health Information Exchange \(HIE\) Workgroup](#) and a [Community Information Exchange \(CIE\) Workgroup](#), to recommend strategies to accelerate, support, and improve HIE and CIE across the state. HITOC's August meeting will review draft CIE recommendations to the legislature as required in House Bill 4150 (2022).
